



REGIONAL DISTRICTS OVERVIEW

- BC is divided into 27 regional districts to provide local governance for unincorporated areas.
 RDN is #5th largest by Population
- Each regional district includes a combination of municipalities and electoral areas.
 RDN has 106 services, Area G contributes to 40 services.
- All Regional Districts are required to provide mandatory services determined by the province to their members as a region.
 Liquid Waste, Solid Waste, Administration, Electoral Areas Administration, EA Areas Planning
- Regional Districts have lesser authority and different representation than Municipalities and provide local government for Unincorporated Areas via Federation Agreements and Bylaws.

RDN AREA G STATS- 2021 Census

- 8,109 Residents all receiving 29 Services from the RDN; And a portion receiving 11 shared services with other areas
- Area G is Second largest EA in RDN by population (Area F has+107 with pop of 8216)
- 7.7% growth since 2016
- 98% residential
- Population Density per square km= 164.4 (compared to Area F of 31.1, E 90.4, H 15.5)
- 9 separate areas including {Englishman River, Martindale, San Pareil}, {Allsbrook Rd} and {Forneau Way, Wildgreen Way, Coldwater Road}, {French Creek}, {Bird Named Streets south of Qualicum Airport, Hilliers}, {Surfside}, {Little Qualicum Riverside}, {Dashwood}.

REGIONAL DISTRICTS OVERVIEW

• On June 8, 2021, the Regional District of Nanaimo Board passed the following resolution:

"That staff engage with the Governance and Structure Branch of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs to conduct the preliminary exploration process for a Restructure and Service Delivery Study of Electoral Area G."

- March 2024: The Ministry of Municipal Affairs has provided a \$45,000 Grant and confirmation that they will proceed with "A Community Issues Assessment."
- For the purpose of Area G's future governance and service delivery.
- Consultation process between consultant and ministry to study Area G Service Delivery Satisfaction and Governance Structure.




RDN GOVERNANCE, POPULATION AND VOTING STRENGTH 2021 CENSUS – POST 2022 ELECTION STRUCTURE

AREA G REPRESENTATION REVIEW AND UPDATES – PLUMMER ROAD

RDN & Parksville ask of Province in 2020:

That the Plummer Road & Island Highway E. Access Plan proceed within the 2020/2021 Fiscal plan; And then that the plan include Pedestrian Access Collaboration Opportunities between the RDN, Parksville, Rathtrevor Provincial Park and MoTI for completion within 5 years.

RDN & Parksville ask of Province in 2021:

That Planning will be funded in the 2021/2022 MOTI Budget, Surveys completed, and progress made to the initial design.

MOTI Statement via MLA Walker's Office As of June 20, 2022:

"MOTI is expecting to receive the first package for the preliminary design in July. Once the design package is received by MOTI and they have had an opportunity to review it, they will be connecting with the RDN Board of Directors and the City of Parksville to provide a more fulsome update, prior to sharing details publicly."

MOTI Meeting with Electoral Area Directors cancelled in Sept 2022:

"Due to the Local Government election blackout period"

MOTI Meeting with Electoral Area Directors February 27, 2023:

MOTI removed Plummer Road from the agenda. Was added to RDN Financial Plan discussions once more.


MOTI Meetings April 2024 – The scope of work was described, and the 2024 work plan was confirmed. MOTI committed to provide a statement of their work prior to this meeting.

MOTI UPDATE FROM MEETING APRIL 18, 2024

- Moti has significantly invested in planning the corridor from Resort Drive to the Orange Bridge.
 - Funding for this has been achieved through joint COP and RDN delegations at multiple UBCMs and continued advocacy through the RDN Board.
- Before the end of 2024 phase one realignment of resort drive at Highway 19, including removing the merge onto Highway 19 (pinball shoot) and realigning resort drive onto highway to improve the Plummer road access onto the highway.
- Phase one also includes a multiuse path, installed by MOTI, managed by the RDN to address pedestrian safety from Resort Drive <u>to</u> Plummer Road.
- 2024/2025 Future phases of improvement include resurfacing the roadway, realigning Plummer Road, and intersection planning in conjunction with the City of Parksville at Greig Road.

NATURE TRUST OF BC

- Nature viewing platform/cover to be installed later this year with parking.
- The entire property is privately owned by Nature Trust of BC.
- Property remains zoned as RS1, and it is not intended to become a public assembly "park."




Restoration continues lot A in 2024/2025
